

COMMITTEE HAS REAL JOB AHEAD

Busy Making Arrangements For Swimming Team To Go To National Meet; Mainland Officials Want a Hawaiian Relay Team

LOCAL A. A. U. officials, especially members of the swimming committee, are busy these days handling arrangements for sending a Hawaiian team to the national swimming championships and Olympic trials to be held on the mainland in June.

The job confronting the swimming committee at present is to select a team—and they are getting plenty of advice on who should be picked, etc. When it comes to the right time to pick the team the swimming committee will no doubt do as good a job of it as possible.

"Dad" Center, chairman of the committee, sent a wire last night to John T. Taylor, chairman of the national swim committee, asking permission for Hawaii to send a relay team representing the Hawaiian association rather than any one club. The feeling among the committee members is that no local club team could cause any sensation in the relay but that a Hawaiian team would have a good chance to win.

Apparently the national swim committee and other mainland officials are anxious to have a relay team from Hawaii entered in the national championships. An allotment of funds has been made to help defray expenses of such a team—the Illinois A. C. being the only other relay team offered funds by the national body.
