

Lincoln Meet Entries Close Monday Night

Diving Requirements Are Changed; Officials of Meet Are Chosen

The entries for the annual Lincoln swimming meet scheduled for the Memorial pool on May fifth will close Monday night at 7 o'clock. Practically all the island aquatic stars who performed in the A. A. U. championship meet are expected to appear on the program.

Victor Ligda announced yesterday that eight dives will be required from those entered in this event, a swan dive, back dive, front jack knife, half gainer, and four optional dives. It has been the custom in past meets to demand 11 dives. Ligda also announced that should more than six entries be placed for the diving, trials will have to be held, and these trials will take place at 4 p. m. on Friday.

Should there be more than 12 entries in any one event trials will also have to be held.

The 100 meters freestyle for women promises to be one of the features of the meet. Lily Bowmer May, Mariechen Wehselau and Mildred Slight are all expected to enter this event.

In the 400 meters freestyle, "Buster" Crabbe of the Outrigger club will go after a world's record. In this event with Crabbe will be young Kalili and Bill Newport who have shown plenty of class already this year.

There will also be a special youngsters R. O. T. C. relay on the program.
