

Local Swimming Ace Is Given Scholarship By The Yale University

Crabbe Also Received Other Invitations From Mainland Institutions But Selected Yale

Clarence ("Buster") Crabbe, national one mile swimming champion and member of the Outrigger Canoe club, will enter Yale university next fall.

Crabbe, who was graduated from Punahou school last fall, has received a scholarship at Yale and decided to enter that institution. This decision was reached after much consideration, Crabbe having received urgent invitations from a number of mainland institutions.

The champion swimmer had also received an appointment to West Point but decided not to follow a military career.

Crabbe will continue his swimming at Yale and much is expected of him as he will be in the hands of a good coach. His early training under the tutelage of "Dad" Center has carried Buster to a national title and it is expected he will hold a world's championship after the Olympic swims.

The Outrigger star will leave for the mainland some time this month to participate in the men's national outdoor swimming championships to be held at San Francisco the first week in June. Following the national swim he will go on to Detroit where he will enter the Olympic trials June 22, 23 and 24.

Followers of the swimming game feel confident that Crabbe will land a berth on the American Olympic swimming team as he appears to be America's outstanding performer in distance swims. The United States figures on Crabbe to carry off first honors in the 1500 meter swim at the Olympics.

Hawaii will also be represented at the women's final Olympic trials to be held at New York the first week in July. Mariechen Wehseleu and Lily Bowmer May will be sent to the trials—provided financial arrangements can be made. The finance committee of the local A. A. U. now has the matter in hand and will make plans within a few days for financing the trip.
