Another champion participant in the local meet will be Clarence "Buster" Crabbe, who recently arrived from Honolulu and has been working out daily in the Fleishhacker pool. He was accompanied here by "Dad" Center, the cagy tank mentor of the Outrigger Canoe Club at Waikiki Beach.

Crabbe won the American mile championship in Honolulu last August when he displayed his marvelous speed and endurance to win by some five yards from Harry Glancy, of the Pennsylvania Athletic Club. The Philadelphian was the favorite in the race, but Crabbe set a pace that had Glancy grasping before the first quarter was passed. He also placed a close second to Johnny Weissmuller in the half-mile event.

According to reports from Honolulu, Crabbe has greatly improved since he won the title last summer. He has been swimming continually since and under the tutelage of Center. is said to have perfected a style that is close to mechanical perfection.

After the swims here Crabbe will depart for Detroit and start training there for the Olympic tryouts to be held there.

Another Honolulu swimmer who has been attracting a great deal of attention as an entrant in the San Francisco events is Lily Bowmer May, who recently set a new record in Honolulu for the 100-meter dash for women. She will compete against Eleanor Garatti and Monta Morgan, noted coast mermaids, and when the trio get together another new record is expected to be written in the books.
