

# IM TOMORROW

## Three Kahanamoku Boys Will Swim; First Event At Ala Wai At 11 A. M.

Races Will Start Off Bridge Near Diamond Head End of Canal; Three Events On Program

**T**HIRTY-SIX swimmers are entered in the fourth annual Star-Bulletin canal swims to be staged at the Ala Wai at 11 o'clock tomorrow morning.

Up to yesterday noon 19 swimmers had signed up but before the entry lists were closed at 4 p. m., a number of others had filed their entries.

Five swimmers from the Central Y. M. C. A., entered the junior swim shortly before entries closed. They are Itaru Wakuya, Malcolm Paoa, Melvin Paoa, Kapua Harris and William Asing.

Three of the Kahanamoku boys, Louis, Sergeant and Sam, also filed their entries, going into the senior one mile swim. This makes four members of the famous Kahanamoku family who are entered, Kapiolani Kahanamoku being entered in the half mile swim for girls.

The records now standing for the three swims are considered very fast times and the swimmers will have to step lively if they are to set any new marks tomorrow. The record for the half-mile swim for women is 12 minutes 28 4-5 seconds, made by Marie Wehselau in 1927. The record for the one-mile junior swim is 24 minutes 37 seconds made by William Newport in 1927. The best time for the one-mile senior swim was made by Benton Wood in 1926, his time being 23 minutes 33 3-5 seconds. Last year Buster Crabbe won the one-mile senior race but his time was two seconds slower than that made by Wood the previous year.

The first race, the half-mile swim for girls, will start at 11 a. m., a few minutes after the finish of the annual A. C. A. marathon. The finish of the marathon is opposite the start of the canal swims. The one-mile junior swim will be the second event on the program and the one-mile senior swim will be third.
