

RECORDS FALL IN STAR-BULLETIN'S SWIM ON CANAL

Manuella Kalili Wins Senior Race; William Newport Wins In Junior Event

One Mile Senior—Won by Manuela Kalili (Hui Hakani) in 20 minutes 43 1-5 seconds. Breaks old record of 23 minutes 33 3-5 seconds held by Benton Wood.

One Mile Junior—Won by William Newport (Outrigger Club) in 21 minutes 5 4-5 seconds. Breaks old record of 24 minutes 37 seconds held by himself.

Half Mile for Girls—Won by Mildred Slaght (Outrigger Club) in 12 minutes 35 3-5 seconds.

Taking the lead at the start of the race and holding it throughout, Manuela Kalili, Hui Makani distance star, won the senior one mile race in the fourth annual Star-Bulletin canal swims held at the Ala Wai this morning.

In winning the race Kalili clipped almost three minutes off the record for the swim, crossing the finish line in 20 minutes 43 1-5 seconds. The old record for the senior swim was 23 minutes 33 3-5 seconds, made by Benton Wood of the Outrigger Canoe club in 1926.

William Newport of the Outrigger club also broke the old senior mark and his own junior record when he finished the junior one mile swim in 21 minutes 5 4-5 seconds. The old junior record, made last year by Newport, was 24 minutes 37 seconds.

Miss Mildred Slaght of the Outrigger Canoe club came within six seconds of the record established by Mariechen Wehselau last year in the half mile swim for girls. In winning this event Miss Slaght finished in 12 minutes 35 3-5 seconds. Miss Wehselau's record for this race is 12 minutes 28 4-5 seconds.

In each instance the winning swimmer led practically the entire distance. Newport was pressed rather closely in the junior swim by Maiola Kalili, younger brother of the senior race winner, who finished in 21 minutes 42 2-5 seconds. Albert Ogawa of Wahiawa was third in 23 minutes 33 3-5 seconds.

The surprise of the senior race was the showing made by Sam Kahanamoku, well known sprint swimmer. Kahanamoku, who had not competed in any races for several months because of illness, finished second in the senior event. He crossed the finish line in 22 minutes and 10 seconds. H. Brotz, an army swimmer, took third place in the senior race, finishing in 22 minutes 55 3-5 seconds. The first three men were under the old record.

Another feature of the meet was the performance of Ed Keliikuewa of Hui Makani, who swam backstroke the entire distance in the junior mile swim. He finished in

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
