Canoe club, who has been on the mainland for several weeks. cording to information received here this week Miss Cunha practically cinched a berth on the American Olym-pic swimming team a couple of warson

weeks ago by establishing a new
Pacific coast record for the 400
meter swim. She covered the distance in 6 minutes 4 1-5 seconds.

Ernest M. Smith of the San Francisco Examiner figures that with Mariechen and Lily on deck to perform in the San Francisco meet, the 100 meter record will fall. "In the writer's mind there is no doubt but that the world's 100 meters record for women will topple from the record book.'
