

MISS CUNHA SETS RECORD IN SWIM



Lowers Pacific Coast
Mark In 400 Meter
Swim; Charley Chung
Forces Winner To Break
Course Record In Golf
Tournament

WHEN Lily Bower May and Mariechen Wehselau perform in special events at the national championships at San Francisco next week they will probably compete against a former teammate who has been breaking Pacific coast records recently.

The swimmer referred to is Cecily Cunha, formerly of the Outrigger Canoe club, who has been on the mainland for several weeks. According to information received here this week Miss Cunha practically cinched a berth on the American Olympic swimming team a couple of weeks ago by establishing a new Pacific coast record for the 400 meter swim. She covered the distance in 6 minutes 41-5 seconds.

Mariechen Wehselau is expected to perform in the 400 meter event and Miss Cunha will be one of her main rivals. The world's record for the 400 meter swim is held by Martha Norelius.

Ernest M. Smith of the San Francisco Examiner figures that with Mariechen and Lily on deck to perform in the San Francisco meet, the 100 meter record will fall. "Swimming fans are assured the greatest women's swimming race in a decade when these superstars of the tank meet in the century straightaway," Smith wrote. "In the writer's mind there is no doubt but that the world's 100 meters record for women will topple from the record book."
