

HAWAII MERMAN FLASHES RECORD

Woodd Finishes Third;
Lily Bowmer May
Shows Class

SAN FRANCISCO, June 7. —Clarence "Buster" Crabbe, star of the Outrigger Canoe club of Honolulu, this afternoon shattered the world's record for the mile event in the National Amateur Athletic union's outdoor championships. Crabbe's time for the distance was 21 minutes, 35 3-5 seconds.

Arne Borg of Sweden held the previous world's record for the mile. His time was 21 minutes, 41 3-5 seconds, hence the Honolulu sensation, swimming in the Fleishhacker pool, clipped an even six seconds from the mark of the Swedish flash.

Johnny Woodd of the Honolulu Central YMCA, and Lily Bowmer May of the Outrigger Canoe Club both proved that they still make great swimmers in Honolulu. Mrs. May won the 400 meters freestyle event for women and Woodd swam third in the 100 meters freestyle for men.

Crabbe, who came to San Francisco recently with George "Dad" Center, cagy coach of the Outrigger club, entered today's meet a national champion and when the mile event was over he held a world's championship.

CLAPP IS SECOND

Austin Clapp of the Hollywood Athletic club was second in the mile and Arthur Hargrave of the San Francisco Olympic club was third. The performance of Crabbe was the high-spot of the afternoon. He was expected to do better than he did at the outdoor championships in Honolulu last year when he became a national champion. But his performance of the afternoon caused a wave of amazement to sweep through the
