

OUTRIGGER STAR CAPTURES MEDLEY IN A. A. U. MEET

Weissmuller Fails to Compete in 880; No New Records Are Established; Lily Bowmer May Lose 100 Meters Freestyle to Eleanor Garatti

SAN FRANCISCO, June 10.—The 1928 National Amateur Athletic union's outdoor swimming championships were wound up at the Fleishhacker pool here today with Clarence "Buster" Crabbe of the Outrigger Canoe club of Honolulu winning the 880 yards event.

Crabbe's time for the 880 was 10 minutes, 29 1-5 seconds. His time did not constitute a record, since Johnny Weissmuller of the Illinois Athletic club swam the event at Honolulu last year in 10 minutes, 22 1-5 seconds.

Weissmuller did not swim against Crabbe today and no explanation was offered for his staying out of the race. In the half mile Crabbe easily defeated Austin Clapp of the Hollywood Athletic club who finished second.

Tom Blankenberg, 17 year old youth of Oakland, this afternoon defeated Walter Spence of the Brooklyn Central Y. M. C. A. in the 440 yards breaststroke event. Blankenberg's time was six minutes, 30 2-5 seconds.

DES JARDINES WINS

The fancy diving competition was taken by Pete Des Jardines of the Roney Plaza pool, Miami, Florida. Mickey Riley of Los Angeles was second in the fancy diving event.

Marion Gillman of Alameda, California, took the 100 meters backstroke event for women. Her time was 26 2-5 seconds.

The San Francisco Olympic club won the Far Western polo championship, defeating the Hollywood Ath-

letic club 8 to 2.

Weissmuller's only appearance today was in a 100 yards exhibition swim. He covered the distance in 52 4-5 seconds.

Yesterday "Buster" Crabbe added to the laurels he gained in the meet just closed when he beat the field in the 300 meters medley race. Crabbe's time for the event was four minutes and 16 seconds flat. It is not a record but it gives the Honolulu boy another national championship. In the medley Crabbe without difficulty defeated George Kojac of the New York Boys' club.

The 880 yards club relay race yesterday was won by the Illinois Athletic club with its star, Weissmuller, finishing. The club established a new record for the race. I. A. C.'s time was nine minutes, 32 3-5 seconds.

In the women's events Saturday Eleanor Garatti won the 100 meters freestyle event against Lily Bowmer May of the Outrigger Canoe club, Honolulu.
