

CRABBE GARNERS HIGHEST HONORS IN COAST SWIMS

His Individual Work Places Outrigger Club Second In Club Point List

SAN FRANCISCO, June 11.—Clarence ("Buster") Crabbe of the Outrigger Canoe club of Honolulu proved the brightest light of the list of nationally known swimming stars who competed in the annual Amateur Athletic Union's men's outdoor swimming championships, which closed here yesterday after four days of competition.

Crabbe took high individual point honors with 18 points, displacing Johnny Weissmuller, individual star for the past several years, in this meet. George Kojac of the New York Boys' club was second with 11 points and Weissmuller, who wears the colors of the Illinois Athletic club of Chicago, was third with 10 points.

Besides breaking his own world's record for the mile swim, Crabbe won first place in the 300-meter medley swim—one-third breaststroke, one-third backstroke, one-third freestyle—and in the 880-yard freestyle, and came in second to Weissmuller in the 440-yard freestyle swim.

Because of its heavy representation the Olympic club team won honors with 22 points, but the blond boy from Waikiki, constituting a one-man team, put the Outrigger Canoe club second with 18 points.

The Hawaiian swimmers—Crabbe, Johnny Woodd of the Honolulu Central Y. M. C. A., Mrs. Lily Bowmer May of the Outrigger club, and Miss Mariechen Wehselau of the Outrigger club—left today for Detroit with their coach, George "Dad" Center. They will participate there in the American Olympic games team trials, June 22 to 24.

Miss Wehselau was indisposed during the four-day meet here, and did not compete.
