WEISSMULLER IS AGAIN WINNER IN CENTURY EVENT

Johnny Woodd Places Fifth In Finals of 100 Meters Olympic Trials

DETROIT, Mich., June 23. — Clarence ("Buster") Crabbe of the Outrigger Canoe club, national one-mile, half-mile and medley swimming champion, hung up the best time made in the 1500 meter heats at the Olympic trials here yesterday.

Crabbe had no difficulty winning his heat and crossed the finish line in 20 minutes 58 4-5 seconds. Oscar Clapp of the Hollywood A. C. won the second heat in 21 minutes 28 4-5 seconds while Ray Ruddy of New York took the third heat in 22 minutes 40 seconds.

Weissmuller Wins

Johnny Weissmuller of the Illinois Athletic club won the finals in the 100-meter swim.

Weissmuller finished the distance in one second more than his world's record. His time was 58 4-5 seconds.

The five other qualifiers for the final heat finished in the following order:

George Kojac, Boys' club, New York, second; Walter Laufer, Chicago, third; John G. Bronson, New York Athletic club, fourth; John C. Woodd, Centray Y. M. C. A., Honolulu, fifth; Paul Simpson, Illinois Athletic club, Chicago, sixth.

Pete Des Jardines led the qualifiers in the 10-foot spring board diving contest, held in conjunction with the Olympic trials.

Des Jardines scored 150.41 points. Mickey Reilly came second with 147.45. Harold Smith was third with 144.58.

Other qualifiers in the diving contest follow in order: Al White, Walter Colbath, Walter Nerandy and Walter Krissel.

Although the Olympic trials were held recently on the Pacific Coast at San Francisco, the officials last night announced that they would decide the makeup of the Olympic teams on the basis of the consistency shown by the swimmers in both of the meets.

One of the upsets of the meet here was the defeat of Buck Shields, Brigham Young university national intercollegiate champion, in the 1500 meters swim. He finished third and failed to qualify.
