

# JOHNNY WOODD WILL MAKE TRIP TO AMSTERDAM

Not Member of Team But  
Will Tour Europe With  
Swimmers After Games

BOSTON, Mass., July 7.

—Johnny Woodd, Hawaii's leading sprint swimmer, and George D. ("Dad") Center, Outrigger Canoe club, are going to Europe this summer, but not officially connected with the American Olympic swimming outfit.

Woodd failed to qualify in the tryouts held at Detroit last month, and Center, although a coach eight years ago, is not on the 1928 staff. However, both plan to go abroad.

Center will probably be a passenger on the official boat, the President Roosevelt, which is sailing with the American team next Wednesday. Woodd, however, will probably go on another boat, as he has not been able to get accommodations on the official boat so far.

Clarence ("Buster") Crabbe, national one mile, half mile and medley swimming champion, will be on the President Roosevelt as a member of the American Olympic team.

Private advices received a few days ago from "Dad" Center stated that some of the American swimmers will tour Germany, Austria and England following the Olympic games at Amsterdam.

He stated that Johnny Woodd would make the trip to Europe to accompany the team on this tour. Besides Center, Crabbe and Woodd, those who will make the tour are George Kojac, sprinter and backstroker; Walter Laufer, sprinter and backstroker; Mickey Riley and Smith, divers; Fred Cady, swimming coach, and Dr. Francois D'Eliscue, who was referee of the 1927 national championships at Honolulu.
