Last spring, in one of the club's meets, Burt took the southern metropolis by storm by covering the two miles run in 9 minutes and 35 seconds. He came back later to uphold this reputation by running the mile in 4 minutes and 26 seconds, which by far eclipses any marks for these distances in the islands.

In Burt's letters to Henry Medeiros, he wished to be remembered to his friends here and especially to Bernard Farden, and to J. P. Morgan, sponsor of the territorial six-mile run which he won.

Henry Medeiros, who received word from Hooper, is an ardent admirer of Burt's and attributes much of his success on the cinders to the many fine points which Hooper handed down to him when they trained together some three years back.

Hooper mentioned that he hoped to return to Hawaii and named 1930 as the likely time.

His friends here will undoubtedly be glad to hear of Burt's success and would certainly like to see him return to the isles.
