Addition of Two World Beaters Will Boost Swimming At Yale

Word to this effect was brought back from the mainland by Center, who said that colleges and univer-sities in all parts of the country were even to have been been were anxious to have Buster enroll but that the Honolulu boy had his mind set on going to Yale.

The announcement that Kojac will enroll at Yale came as quite a sur-prise as the New York boy is very young and at the time he visited here last fall his scholastic standing was not high enough to get him into Yale.

Has Changed "You wouldn't know George now." Center said. "He has been attend-ing Rutgers since he left Honolulu last fall and picked up enough in his school work so that he is eligible scholastically to enter Yale."

Kojac and Crabbe have become very friendly, Center reports, and were berthed in the same room on board the President Roosevelt en route to the Olympic games at Amen

With Crabbe and Kojac as a nu-leus around which to build a team, and other star swimmers who have been developed at Yale the past ear or two that university will have an exceptionally powerful team.

"I am glad Buster decided to go Yale rather than a university in e west," Center said. "He will get chance to enter swimming compeitions about seven months out of he year in the east. There are not meets staged in the west."
