

Crabbe Ill But Plans To Compete On Saturday

Buster Finds Himself In
Same Heat With Borg
and Charleton

AMSTERDAM, Holland, Aug. 1.—Clarence "Buster" Crabbe of the Out-rigger Canoe club, Honolulu, and America's chief hope in the 1,500 meters swimming race against Arne Borg of Sweden and Boy Charlton of Australia, today was recovering from an ailment of the stomach which has been causing him trouble for a day or two.

This afternoon Crabbe told the United Press that he does not expect his recent physical disorder to bother him in actual competition. He appeared strong in today's workout and expects to be in prime condition when he swims in the 1500 meters trials on Saturday.

MEETS BORG, CHARLETON

Additional drawings for the swimmers at the Olympic games here were made today. Crabbe will swim against Borg and Charleton in the fifth heat of the 1500 meters trials. Also against him in this heat will be Tamse of the Philippine Islands.

Most prominent in the first heat of the 1500 meters trials will be Takebayashi of Japan and Austin Clapp of the United States. Aral of Japan will swim in the second heat. Ray Ruddy of the United States and Takashi of Japan will swim in the third heat of the 1500 meters, while in the fourth heat will be Albert
