Crabbe Third In Long Swim: Record Broken

(UNITED PRESS BY R. C. A.) AMSTERDAM, Holland, Aug. 6.—(Monday)— Arne Borg of Sweden today became the Olympic champion for the 1500 meters freestyle swimming race when he won the finals of the event here.

Borg covered the distance in 19 minutes, 514/5 seconds, establishing a new Olympic and world's record. The old record, held by Boy Charlton of Australia, was 20 minutes, 63/5 seconds, established at Paris in 1924.

Charlton was second today while Clarence "Buster" Crabbe of the Outrigger Canoe club, Honolulu, was third. Charlton's time was 20 minutes, 23/5 seconds. Crabbe's time was 20 minutes, 284/5 seconds.

Ray Ruddy of the New York Athletic club was fourth, and Alberto Zorrilla of the Argentine was fifth.

Borg was leading at the 500 meters mark. Charlton then was eight meters behind the Swedish swimmer and Crabbe was ploughing strongly in third position. He was then two meters behind the Australian.

At the 1000 meters mark Borg was still leading and Charlton was gaining. Crabbe then was fifteen meters behind Charlton. Borg's time at the 1000 meters mark was 13 minutes, 4 1/5 seconds.
