

BUSTER PUTS UP GREAT BATTLE

Martha Norelius Wins Women's 400 Meters Free Style

AMSTERDAM, Holland,

Aug. 6.—Interest in the Olympic games today centered on the swimming events which were featured by spectacular races and new world's records.

Arne Borg of Sweden won the finals of the 1,500 meters free style swimming event in 19 minutes, 51 4-5 seconds. His time is a new world's and Olympic record, shattering that established by Boy Charlton at Paris in 1924.

The old record held by Charlton was 20 minutes, 6 3-5 seconds. Charlton finished second today. His time was 20 minutes, 2 3-5 seconds. Clarence "Buster" Crabbe of the Outrigger Canoe club, Honolulu, was third. His time was 20 minutes, 28 4-5 seconds.

Ray Ruddy of the New York Athletic club finished fourth. Fifth place went to Alberto Zorrilla of Argentina, while sixth place went to Ault of Canada.

Martha Norelius of the United States won the finals of the 400 meters freestyle event for women. Her victory came easy, but she shattered the world's and Olympic records. Her time was 5 minutes, 42 4-5 seconds. Miss Braun of Holland was second, while Josephine McKim of the United States was third. Miss Stewart of England was fourth, Miss Vandergoes of South Africa was fifth and Miss Tanner of England was sixth.

In the trial heats for the 200 meters breaststroke event Tsuruta of Japan, winner of the fourth, cracked the Olympic record. His
