was third in this heat. Borg covered the distance in five minutes, 52/5 seconds. Crabbe swam the 400 meters in five minutes, 62/5 seconds while Clapp's time was five minutes, 64/5 seconds.

In the first heat of the 400 meters race, Alberto Zorrilla of Argentina finished first. He swam ahead of Boy Charlton of Australia who was second. Ray Ruddy of the New York Athletic club was third in this heat.
