

CRABBE IS LOCATED IN AUSTRIA



Associated Press 'Finds'
Outrigger Club Merman
For His Father; Foot-
ball Fans Insist On See-
ing Dayton Team In
Action

AFTER being "missing" for several days Clarence ("Buster") Crabbe, Hawaii's swim star who participated in the Olympic swims at Amsterdam, was "found" yesterday by The Associated Press.

Three or four days ago Ned Crabbe, Buster's father, sent a radio message to the Outrigger star, addressing it to Buster on the S. S. Roosevelt, the ship that brought the American team back from the Olympics. Ned got an answer saying that none by the name of Crabbe was aboard the Roosevelt.

Yesterday morning Buster's father asked the Associated Press for assistance in locating his son—and within three hours Buster was located in Austria, where he is apparently appearing in exhibition swims.

Within an hour after the first message came through about Buster another was received telling how he swam a 300-meter backstroke race in world's record time.
