Police. All four crews were even at the last 200 yards mark.

Hilo carried the sprint and jumped into the lead followed by Cops. Healani fell back as they sprinted and Hilo continued to gain. Police responded to the final shout of the coxswain and shot inot second and then—at the very end of the race, leaped across the line a scant foot ahead of the Big Island entrant. Healani shot into third place at the line. It was the best finish of the day, the Cops winning after one of the most brilliant sprints ever witnessed in a Regatta. Time, 9:46 4-5. The Cops made it a big day by scoring two victories, the first since they entered rowing.

INTERMEDIATE

Myrtle and Healani got away to a perfect start, the best of the day. Healani shot into the lead and held it on the way out. Myrtle struck up a stiff stroke and held its position a halflength back. Myrtle jumped into a slight lead at the lighthouse but there was still little difference between the crews.

Healani took the lead again and made the flag first, rounding and coming into the stretch two lengths ahead of Myrtle.

As the boats swung into the stretch, Healani was three lengths to the good and still gaining. Healani sprinted away from Myrtle on the final 200 yards and won by three lengths. Time 9:55 3-5.

Healani's victory enabled the Blues to go into a tie for Regatta honors with Hilo at 14 points each.
