Too Expensive "I think it would be a big mistake to go after that event. Most of the champion women swimmers live in the east and it would cost too much money to bring them to Ha-waii. What we should do is go after the men's national championships

again. "With Weissmuller out of it I am positive that the Outrigger club would win the championship. That would give our boys a chance to go away the following year and I think they should be given that opportunity. It would do them a great deal of good to get up there on the mainland and see the way other clubs are operated, the way

Crabbe expressed the opinion that Manuella Kalili and Bill New-port would have made a good showing at the last national championships. He said they would have taken second or third places.

("Dad") Center, Outrigger club swimming coach, was among those at the dock and Buster's first words were to report to dad on his condition.
