

SWIMMING CHAMPS WILL APPEAR IN TONIGHT'S MEET

Here are the world's champion swimmers who will appear at the swimming meet to be held at the War Memorial Natatorium, Waikiki, at 7:45 o'clock this evening. In addition to the following all of the local stars will perform.

Johnny Weissmuller—Illinois A. C., Chicago, Illinois. Holds 148 records for distances ranging from 50 yards to 800 meters. Is now specializing in sprint events.

Walter Laufer, Lakeshore A. C., Chicago, Illinois. Rated as the world's best all-around swimmer. Is the indoor backstroke champion for 150 yards with a mark of one minute 37 1/5 seconds.

Paul Wyatt, Uniontown Y. M. C. A., Uniontown, Penn. Belongs to relay teams holding world's records for the 200 and 800-meter freestyle distances. Is also former national backstroke champion and is rated as being next to George Kojac and Walter Laufer in the backstroke.

Helen Meaney, Women's Swimming Association, New York. Olympic 10-foot springboard diving champion and national platform diving champion. Was kept out of the platform diving at the Olympics so she could devote her entire time to springboard diving. Is rated as the best diving champion in the history of the Olympic swims.

Clarence ("Buster") Crabbe, Outrigger Canoe club, Honolulu. National one-mile, half mile and medley champion. Also has made world's fastest time in the 300-meter medley. Hawaii's representative on the U. S. swimming team at the 1928 Olympics.
