

OFFER FIVE CUPS TO WINNERS IN OUTRIGGER SWIM

Dr. Paul Withington Enters Men Over 30 Event; Good Times Promised

Five cups will be at stake in the annual Thanksgiving Day swimming program of the Outrigger Canoe club to be held at Waikiki beach.

For the feature event of the day, the Castle swim, Harold Castle has donated a handsome silver goblet. The swim will start from the former Castle home (Elks' club) and end at the anchored canoe off the Moana pier, a distance of a mile and a quarter.

The Star-Bulletin has offered a large cup to the winner in the senior girls' event, from the public baths to anchored canoe. This is a swim of over half a mile.

Through the kindness of the Dawkins, Benny firm, a cup for the event for boys under 18 has been offered. The swim starts from the public baths and finishes at the anchored canoe.

Ford Is Donor

Alexander Hume Ford, Pan-Pacific worker, has donated the other two cups. For the girls' novice event, a swim from Cunha's surf to the anchored canoe, one of these cups will be awarded. The other cup will go to the winner in the boys under 16 event, a swim from Cunha's surf to the anchored canoe.

The "old men's" swim, from public baths to the anchored canoe, has no cup at stake. The committee felt certain that men over 30 would not take a cup if it was awarded and so plans to secure a cup did not materialize. However, the winner will be awarded a gold medal, the second to finish a silver medal and the third man to finish a bronze medal.

In all events gold, silver and bronze medals will be awarded.
