

Arrangements Complete For Paddling Races

Arrangements for the Fifth Annual Surf Board Paddling, Hawaiian Championships, on the Waikiki Canal, New Year's morning, commencing at 9:30 a. m. are about complete. The committee is working hard to make this event even better than it has ever been before.

The Shell Oil Company is sponsoring the meet and shall award handsome gold, silver and bronze medals to the winners (three medals to each event) and individual silver medals to members of the winning relay team.

Length of boards to be used has come up for the usual discussion, but the committee has decided that there shall be no limitations as to size. The only board that is barred is the balsam board—a new arrival on the beach.

The three-fourths mile club relay is drawing considerable interest among the two main beach clubs, the Outrigger Canoe Club and the Hui Nalu Club. Both clubs are selecting their men with care, and the old record of 1 minute 26 4-5 seconds established by the Outrigger Canoe Club in 1926 for this event is in danger of being lowered.
