

# Four Junior Titles At Kahanamoku Swim Feb. 14

Four junior district championships will be the big A. A. U. swimming attraction in the 12 event program arranged for February 14 by the Women's Swimming Association of Hawaii.

The "Kahanamoku Swimfest" promises to be the largest attended meet for any one night program. The races are practically all invitation events.

The Outrigger C. C., the Nuuanu "Y," The Star-Bulletin A. A., the Queen's Surfriders, W. S. A. of Hawaii, University of Hawaii, and other organizations interested in swimming will enter their members.

The appearance of the popular and internationally known duet of Duke Kahanamoku and Norman Ross in special exhibitions will be a feature event of the program.

The Duke, who is in condition and working hard for another chance at titular honors in the next Olympic games to be held at Long Beach, Cal., will give an exhibition of his speed swimming and various strokes.

California with its many swimming organizations seldom arranges a program of events without the appearance of the well known Los Angeles A. C. aquatic star. The Duke made his last showing here in 1927 during the men's senior outdoor na-

tional championships.

He is capable of giving all his younger competitors a very hard race. The public will see the smoothest and fastest human for his age as he paces through the waters of the Natatorium.

Norman Ross is still one of the best all-around swimmers in competition. He has won prizes from sprints to 15 mile open water events and can still step out and make excellent time.

Swimming enthusiasts who have never seen the former Illinois A. C. star in action will be given a real treat. Norman is colorful. He has made a name for himself throughout the world.

## Relay Event

The relay will be another interesting event. The Kahanamoku family quartet representing the Hui Nalu will be entered it is hoped as a team in the 400 meter race.

In addition to the junior district A. A. U. championship medals being given for the title events, the committee in charge will award gold, silver and bronze medals for the other races.

Special prizes are being planned for the famous Duke and Norman Ross with other special novelties as part of the program.
