

SECOND WEEK OF SERIES ATTRACTS 73 CONTESTANTS

12 Clubs Competing For Honors; Brilliant Swimming Marks Recorded

The second week of the big swimming program, being sponsored weekly at the Waikiki natatorium by The Star-Bulletin, went off with another loud report Saturday afternoon when 12 separate organizations and 73 contestants participated in the attractive list of events.

The total of competitors Saturday represented the largest entry list to be received for any one aquatic event since the 1930 swimming activities started. This was also an increase of some 15 per cent over the opening week's list which totaled 64.

Aliiolani school, Lincoln Junior high, Washington Junior high, McKinley high, University of Hawaii, St. Louis college, W. S. A. of Hawaii, Outrigger C. C., Citywide A. A., Star-Bulletin A. A., Fort De Russy, Fort Shafter and Hui Nalu had entries who scored points for their clubs and educational institutions.

It was a convincing showing of the necessity for the development of interest in learning and competing under favorable helpful swimming conditions.

The outstanding point winners were: Girls under 13 — Frances Reuter, Citywide, 9 points; Lavinia Watson, unattached, 9 points. For boys under 13—John Toomey, Aliiolani H. S., 7 points; Albert Silva, Hui Makani, 7 points. For girls under 16—Olga Clark, Outrigger Canoe club, 10 points. Boys under 16—Kazumi Hiramoto, Hui Makani, 10 points.

Men open—Moses Moepono, McKinley H. S., 10 points. Women open — Mildred Slaght, Outrigger C. C., 10 points.

Many of the experienced women swimmers from the various clubs added more interest to the competitions.

Jean Smith, Mildred Slaght, Olga Clark, Beatrice Nicoll, Josephine Hunter caused upsets. There were two heats necessary in the 100 meters for men.

Moses Moepono of McKinley surprised the officials and old-timers by winning the 120 yard individual medley in 1 minute 28 seconds. This young man will bear watching in all future races.
