

# ANNOUNCE PLANS FOR SWIM EVENT AT NATATORIUM

All Organizations Invited To  
Enter Swimmers In Three  
Events

The sixth annual Star-Bulletin one-mile swim will be held at the war memorial natatorium Decoration Day, May 30. The three popular races will start at 10:30 a. m.

The one-mile race\* for senior men, the one-mile for juniors, 16 years and under, and the half-mile for women will be feature events of a special program in which the entrants will vie for junior district titles at the same time.

Last year's announcement attracted the largest entry in the history of the yearly swimfest and with more activity, more interest and better condition of the swimmers, new records and fast times should be recorded.

The condition of the Ala Wai does not permit an open water swim as originally planned, but the 100 meter pool, will give every swimmer a chance to win two titles in one race.

#### Are Eligible

Junior district or senior district freestyle winners can enter the one mile championships, but cannot become title holders. The two races will be run as The Star-Bulletin event.

The regular Star-Bulletin gold, and bronze medals will be given in the three events. Entry blanks will be ready in a short time for distribution.

Entries will close with Don Watson, Star-Bulletin, May 26 at 6 p. m. This will give the committee in charge time to arrange the lanes accordingly. If the entry list becomes too great the time of the races will be arranged so as to give each contestant a lane in the pool.

#### Send Invitations

Invitations will be sent to all the other islands to send one or more representatives as Decoration Day is Friday and the holiday will permit traveling.

Fort De Russy, Shafter, Hui Makani, Washington Jr. High, Nuuanu "Y," University of Hawaii and Outrigger, with unattached entries will be the representative organizations in the competitions.
