

Outrigger Volley Ball Boys Take Hot Battle

Pals Go Down; Nuuanu Y. Slammers Bow to Smoke Eaters

OUTRIGGER Canoe Club and Palama Settlement engaged in the hottest contest of the season last night in the Senior A. A. U. volleyball league at the Central Y court before a yelling packed house. Flashing signs of their former greatness, the OCC team showed up unexpected well and the Pals had to battle fiercely to take a 16-14 and 15-12 victory. The champion Fire Department slammers defeated the Nuuanu Y in a raged game, in two sets, 15-2 and 15-9.

Their performance last night was the best of the year and indicated that Palama and the Outriggers will have to be reckoned with when the final dividing of honors is made. They stand a fine chance to cop the title, though Outrigger lost, it does not eliminate them from the pennant race.

OUTRIGGERS RALLY

The Winged P's started out suspiciously by taking three points after a tough scrimmage but Tom Singlehurst, May and Morton worked hard to bring the Paddlers close to the victors and stayed there. Palama was leading 10-9 when the Beachcombers unleashed a brilliant attack, taking five points before a bewildered Pal squad. Canario Dease and G. Perry were in the thick of it and helped May. Singlehurst put over the killing shots. The winners crept up little by little as the OCC teamwork failed to function. The swimmers earned another point and lacked but one more to carry away the set.

At this stage, the Pals got Louis Morton, "the terrible Dane" in front and this boy slammed them through for the three points necessary to win the set, 16-14.

The Outriggers again stuck close to the Pals in the second set. A sudden spurt put the victors in front 12-8 but "Dog" May's great slamming evened matters. May however undid all his splendid work by two blunders, and the Pals taking advantage, crashed through for the winning points.

Morton was outstanding for his terrific slamming while Bruhn came in for some honors in that line. George Telles, a small fellow, was very good. K. F. Chow, Tom Hugo and Alec McKee did mighty good work in retrieving slams and furnished the set-ups for the slammers.

Hitting with either hand, Singlehurst was the best for the Outriggers while Perry was great in blocking slams. The rest of the team contributed their share of the fine stand, the Beachmen put up.
