

FINAL RACES OF STAR-BULLETIN'S SERIES MAY 31

Ten Juvenile Championships Will Be Decided At Nata- torium Saturday

Ten juvenile championships, two junior district A. A. U. relay events, 10 other title races for all ages and the awarding of 40 prizes will feature the final Star-Bulletin swimfest when the 20 weeks of competition will be completed at the natorium, Saturday, May 31, at 2 p. m.

Four months of weekly races, days of hard practices and consistent work has developed more swimmers and shattered more records, established more swimming interest than at any time in the history of aquatics in the islands.

The final program of events will formally introduce into competition juvenile

champions under 13 years of age.

Relay for Women

The 400 meter relay for women should bring together Outrigger, W. S. A. of Hawaii, University of Hawaii and a possible school team. This will be a preliminary championship to the senior races to be held June 4 in the big gala Acme meet.

The 880 yard relay for men should bring a championship to a new club, as Hui Makani will not be eligible to swim the Kalili brothers or Furusho, who have already won freestyle titles. However, Harvey Chilton will no doubt have another fast team in the race.

Fort Shafter, Battery A of 16th C. A., Nuuanu Y. Outrigger, Washington and a few other teams may enter the junior event, preliminary to the senior event scheduled for June 5 at the senior A. A. U. swimfest.

Juvenile Events

Ten juvenile championships will be open to all boys and girls 13 years and under:

50-yard Freestyle for boys and girls.

50 yard Backstroke for boys and girls.

50 yard Breaststroke for boys and girls.

Diving: Three compulsory — Running, swan, running front jack-knife, backward header and three optionals.

120 yard Medley—Three styles, boys and girls.

160 yard Freestyle relay, boys and girls.

In addition to the schedule championships the following events and special races will be held:

50 yard Freestyle, boys and girls under 13. Championship.

100 meter Freestyle, boys and girls under 16.

100 meter Freestyle, boys under 18.

100 meter Freestyle, women.

100 meter Freestyle, men.

400 meter Breaststroke, open.

50 yard Backstroke, boys and girls under 13. Championship.

300 meter Medley, boys and girls under 16.

300 meter Medley, women.

300 meter Medley, men, boys under 18.

220 yard Breaststroke, women, open.

50 yard Breaststroke, boys and girls under 13. Championship.

Diving: Boys and girls under 13. Championship.

880 yard Relay, men. Junior district championship.

400 meter Relay, women. Junior district championship.

120 yard Medley, boys and girls under 13. Championship.

50 yard Freestyle, men and women, open.

Exhibition diving.

160 yard Freestyle relay, school championship. Under 13, for boys and girls.

Presentation of prizes by Joseph A. Farrington, Editor, Star-Bulletin.

Five prizes in each class and three championship trophies to be awarded to schools, clubs, organizations and individual entries.

The schools will have their own sections and all contestants will be required to officially enter at 1:30 at the gate. There will be admission by ticket only so the crowd in the pool will be under control of the officials.
