

ONE MILE SENIOR RACE DRAWS BEST LOCAL SWIMMERS

Many Young Swimmers Will
Appear In Open Competi-
tion For First Time

The Star-Bulletin's sixth annual one-mile swim for men and boys and half-mile for women will decide two junior district championships and bring together for the first time this year the outstanding men and women in the Hawaiian association capable of lowering the times made in all previous races. The first race is scheduled for 10:30 a. m. on Decoration Day at the natatorium.

The three place winners of last year's race, Manuella and Maloia Kalili and Maurice Furusho, will again represent Hui Makani in the one-mile for men. Manuella won the 1929 race in 23 minutes 42 1-5 seconds, defeating his brother Maloia, who at the

present time is stronger and has been in more open competitions. Maloia should win the one mile, with his brother or Maurice Furusho second. Harold Hanhy of Fort Shafter may surprise with a third place

Senior Record

The senior record for the one mile is held by the all around popular national champion, Buster Crabbe, who established the mark of 21 minutes 52 2-5 seconds in 1927 at the local championships. Maloia is swimming around Buster's time now and the senior record may be bettered. The Kalili brothers have a personal water argument to settle and tomorrow is the day!

Mildred Slaght of McKinley and Outrigger, who won the one mile for women in 27 minutes 30 3-5 seconds, is again entered, and will attempt to establish a new association mark for that distance. Mildred has been in active competition for the last five months and one of the outstanding popular point winners in the weekly swimfests. She will have eight competitors against her.

First Appearance

The race for women will bring together experienced, older and well known women swimmers against a youthful group of girl paddlers representing W. S. A., who are in open competition for the first time this year. The results of the race will be interesting, as it will give the officials an opportunity for the first time this season to witness in the water the middle distance mermaids from our district.

The following is the official list of entries as approved by the registration committee of the Hawaiian association. The one mile for men: Dennis Fuller, Henry Smith, Leslie Ryan, Walter Peterson, Charles Wallace, William Waidlich and John Jula will represent Battery "A." 16th C. A. Captain Hindle will take charge of the trophy to be presented to Battery "A."

Maurice Furusho, Maloia Kalili, Manuella Kalili are the three men who will represent Hui Makani. Harold Hanhy, Fort Shafter; Albert Stevenson, McKinley; Sam Reid, unattached; William Kahele, unattached; Moses Moepono, Nuuanu "Y," and Andrew Hanaoka, Star-Bulletin; A. A. Takafugi, Nuuanu "Y," Itaru Wakuya, Central "Y."

The one mile swim for boys 16 years and under finds many entrants who must clear at once with H. O. Pfaender at the Nuuanu "Y" because of registration.
