Kamehameha Day Water Carnival Committee Announces Ruling

A recent announcement by Duke Kahanamoku, chairman of the Kamehameha Day water carnival committee, says that all entrants in the surfboard paddling and surfing contest to be held on June 11th at Waikiki, will not be allowed to use boards other than standard craft, not more than twelve feet long.

This announcement came as a result of complaints that some entrants might take advantage of the new cigar boards and the hollow boards, thereby putting the users of the standard board at a distinct disadvantage.

In the same announcement Kahanamoku said that in the open paddling race any make of board would be allowed. This announcement forecasts the use of cigar and hollow boards exclusively in that event.

Other plans for the water carnival are rapidly materializing. The outrigger cances that are being fitted up for the sailing race are nearly ready and a few days will see them in practice spins over the triangular shaped course which is being laid out by the members of the beach clubs at Waikiki.

The latest trophy donation for the carnival was that put up by the Inter-Island Steamship Company. That concern will donate trophies to the first three cances that finish in the cance padding championship race. The cups will be up for perpetual competition until one club has won three times, thence it becomes the permanent property of that club.
