

# MAIOLA KALILI AGAIN STARS

## Rose Simerson Wins from Lily Bowmer May In 100 Freestyle

THE Ace Swimming meet featuring Hawaiian championships was brought to a close at the We Memorial natatorium last night with the meet laurels going to Harvey Chilton's Eui Makani boys by an overwhelming margin. The final calculations showed Eui Makani with 52 points. Kuanani Y was second with 27, Eui Nahu third with 11, Polama next with 9 and Central Y fifth with 8. Army and Unattached entries garnered 7 each and the University of Hawaii collected 3.

Maiola Kalili who with his brother, Manuella, cleaned-swept all the championships Wednesday night, added two more crowns to his already bulging belt last night, romping home ahead of the field in the 300 meters medley and the 880 yard freestyle. In the 300 medley, he was clocked in 4 minutes 13 seconds which ties the Hawaiian record, held by Buster Crabbe. His time was just 4-5 of a second slower than the American mark. With a little pressing, he would have undoubtedly brought another American mark to the Hawaiian waters. He was led by Sam Kahanamoku for the first 100 meters, swimming breaststroke but went into the lead with the backstroke and coasted in an easy victor.

In the 880 he won by 75 yards winning from Maurice Furusha. His time was slow, 10:56.1.
