Miss Simerson who is Gay Harris' University of Hawaii sensation, went in the lead from the start and although challenged by the experienced Lily May near the finish, held her own to win by a scant yard. She was clocked in 1:11-4 which is remarkable time considering the fact that this is about the third time that the Varsity co-ed splashed in the Memorial pool. She started off at a killing pace and did not let up in the least until she hit the finish.

Three other champions were crowned during the night. Henry Souza defended his title in the 440 breaststroke.

Then Lily Bowmer May came back to take the 220 back stroke. The third championship was decided in the 440 yards freestyle for women, and then after a brilliant race between Loretta Gillespie and Lorena Hines. The two Outrigger maidens battled stroke for stroke for three laps, then Miss Gillespie pulled away from Miss Hines on the home stretch. The margin of victory was extremely close.

Miss Olga Clark established a new record in the 100 breaststroke for girls under 16. Her time was 1:37.

Hui Makani brought the meet to a close with a triumph in the 880 yards club relay, Hawaiian championship, winning from Hui Nalu.

A surprisingly small crowd witnessed the meet. The McKinley High school band was on hand and rendered several selections during the evening.

The meet honors for women went to the Outrigger club with 56 points. The W.S.A.H. was second with 15 points and the University third with 8.
