

SIX HUI MAKANI MEN INVITED TO JOIN THE SQUAD

Strongest Possible Team to Represent Hawaii Is Aim of Committee

The swimming committee of the Hawaiian Association of the A. A. U. today announced the personnel of the All-Hawaiian swimming team to represent Hawaii against the Yale and Meiji university teams in the international meet at the War Memorial natatorium July 17-18-19.

Twenty-one of Hawaii's best swimmers have been invited to perform as members of the team. The list includes six swimmers from Hui Makani, five from Hui Nalu, three from Nuuanu "Y," two each from Central "Y" and Fort De Russy, and one each from the University of Hawaii, Outrigger Canoe club and unattached.

The clubs of which the swimmers are members will be listed on the program but the mermen will perform as an All-Hawaiian team and not as from individual clubs. In this way the committee feels Hawaii will have the strongest possible representation in the meet.

Central "Y"—Kapua Harris and Sam Harris.

Fort De Russy—William Pegman and Richard Louttit.

University of Hawaii—Vernon Harry.

Outrigger Canoe Club—William Crow.

Unattached—Bud Crabbe.

C. Dudley Pratt, chairman of the A. A. U. swimming committee, plans a meeting with the members of the All-Hawaiian team and will discuss with them plans for distribution of the swimmers among the various races, the idea being to have the strongest possible lineup.

In addition to the 21 members of the All-Hawaiian team there will be eight swimmers from Meiji university and 14 from Yale university. Clarence ("Buster") Crabbe, individual high point winner at the national championships which closed at Long Beach, Cal., Sunday, is also returning home and will be here in time to compete in the big meet.
