

# LOCAL STARS TO TRY FOR JUNIOR NATIONAL TITLES

## Announce More of Plans For Three Night Swimming Meet At Natatorium

The 300 meter junior national A. A. U. championship of the United States for men and women will be conducted by the Hawaiian association, as part of the three night international program to be contested at the war memorial natatorium on July 17, 18 and 19.

The medley for women will be held on the opening night and the race for men on July 18. The three style championship being open to a n y registered swimmer, will give the mermen from Yale and Meiji university an opportunity to compete for a national title in addition to their other intercollegiate distances.

The Outrigger will be asked to enter Lillie Bower May, Loretta Gillespie, Mildred Slight, Olga Clark, Lorena Hines and the Hammond sisters. The W. S. A. of Hawaii will be invited to race Mac Westcoat, Jean Smith, Barbara Bari, Beatrice and Barbara Nicoll, and possibly Margaret Toomey.

Other organizations like Palama, University of Hawaii, and many unattached swimmers who desire to compete in the medley championships are requested to get in touch with Dudley C. Pratt, chairman, swimming committee or at the sports desk of The Star-Bulletin, with the writer.

The other open events for boys and girls, men and women will be forwarded to the organizations with a request that only their best two performers be entered.

It is the desire of the committee not to eliminate any swimmer who is known and capable of finishing the race in fair time. An overcrowded list of entries is not necessary. There will be no heats.

Each race is to be a final event and in every race there will not be more than 10 entries accepted. The first event will be the 50 meter freestyle for boys under 13 in which K. Imori, the junior all around champion, will surprise the college men with his super speed.

The events are to start at 8 p. m. each night, and the evening program to be completed by 9:30 p. m. Another feature of the special three nights of swimming will be the musical concert by three noted bands.

The 298th Infantry Military band, a band from the army and the Royal Hawaiian band will start festivities at 7:30 p. m. for the thousands of people who are expected to crowd the natatorium on the three nights of competition.

The committee is planning to present the program of events in the same manner as the international group conducts its swimming competitions. It will be a real pre-Olympic meeting of aquatic stars.
