

84 SWIMMERS TO COMPETE IN MEET AT NATATORIUM

American and Olympic Stars
Will Be Seen in Almost
Every Event

Eighty-four contestants, world record holders, inter-collegiate title-holders, national champions of the United States, Olympic winners and participants, association and district leaders, now juvenile champions of Hawaii, representing universities, colleges, clubs and associations, have been officially entered for the three night international swimming meet to be held at the War Memorial natatorium July 17, 18 and 19.

The large entry of individual aquatic stars from Japan, the presence of Yale university, inter-collegiate champions of the United States, and the return of Clarence Buster Crabbe and Maola Kalili from the national title events brings to

Pre-Olympic Meeting

The international swimming program of events will surpass any other competitions ever staged in the islands. It is a pre-Olympic meeting and Pan-Pacific preparation for the possible Hawaiian Olympics in 1932!

Every race scheduled for the three nights promises world or American record breaking performances. No event on the program, including the under 13-year races, will be slow.

Records Should Fall

Records should fall before the largest crowd ever to witness such an array of stars for one championship meeting.

The swimming committee worked very diligently to print the official list so that the public, too, can become as interested and enthused as the officials connected with the meet. The rivalry for dual title honors between Yale university and Meiji university increases daily.

Instructions and Tickets

The official list published is subject to change. Local swimmers whose names appear in all the events should be certain of their registration. Instructions to swimmers and tickets for all contestants will be mailed today for the three nights.
