Hawaii is proud of the fine performances of these two aquatic stars. They have enabled the islands to stage a comeback in swimming. Once again the eyes of the swimming world are focused on Hawaii as the place where world's champions are made.

Kalili is the national champion in the 440 yard event. Crabbe is the champion in the mile, half-mile and medley. Kalili is also rated right now as being next to George Kojac in the backstroke.

The two boys constitute an entire swimming team.

This is Buster's second year as individual high point winner in the national championships. But he is still in his prime as a swimmer. These two boys should be the nucleus of the American Olympic swimming team in 1932.
