

# NEW SWIM RECORDS SET UP LAST NIGHT

The Hui Makani 800 meter relay team created an unofficial world record at the Memorial pool last night. Johnny Woodd, Manuella Kalili, Maurice Furucho and Maiola Kalili, members of the team, negotiated the distance in 9 minutes 29 2-5 seconds, beating the Olympic record held by the United States team of Austin Clapp, W. Laufer, G. Kojac and J. Weismuller, of 9 minutes 36 1-5 seconds, by 6 4-5 seconds.

Buster Crabbe swam the 800-meter freestyle event in 10 minutes 15 2-5 seconds and this is also regarded as a world record although no official mark is recognized at the present time.

Applications of these marks for world records will be made by the Hawaiian A. A. U.

Muriel Swift (WSA) knocked off five seconds from her 52 seconds record in the 50 meter backstroke for girls under 13. Her time was 47 seconds flat.

Olga Clark, Outrigger, bettered her own record of 1 minute 36 3-5 seconds by 12-5 seconds, winning the 100-meter backstroke event for girls under 16, in 1 minute 35 1-5 seconds.

Sammy Harris of the Central Y created a new Junior National A. A. U. championship for men in the 300-meter medley race, swimming the distance in 4 minutes 47 4-5 seconds.
