Ned Crabbe, "Buster's" father, received a letter from his son in which the world's champion swimmer declares he will not even enter the Olympic trials unless he is in first class condition.

"Buster" says his studies at the university keep him so busy that he has only a half an hour a day which he can devote to training. He declares that is not sufficient time to give to training and for that reason he is not in very good shape for competitive swimming at the present time.
