for Outrigger Canoe Club, pulled another big surprise in beating out the field to take a first and only 3-5 of a second behind Malcolm Love's championship record. James Hoke of Queen Surfers came in a close second and Wendelin Bayne of Hui Nalu right behind him for a third.

The big upset of the day came in the last race of the regatta when the Outrigger Canoe Club beat out the championship Hui Nalu relay team and established a new record of 7 minutes 43 2-5 seconds, beating the Hui Nalu time by 11 3-5 seconds.

This team consisted of six men each paddling 220 yards: 1, "Toots" Minville; 2, Sam Reid; 3, Fred Logan; 4, Richard Bechert; 5, Wilbur Craw, and 6, Jack May. Duke Kahanamoku, famous local aquatic luminary, who holds the unofficial record time of 1 minute 10 seconds for the 220 yards, did not compete as was expected; however, the famous Duke was the referee of the event, and largely responsible for its huge success.

The sponsors of the meet, the Dawkins' Benny Co., Ltd., represented by Cecil G. Benny, were well pleased with the results and the snappy time in which they were run off. The entire ten events took exactly 1 hour and 35 minutes.
