

J. Woodd Noses Out Bud Crabbe In 100 Open

Time 54 Seconds Flat;
Pang Crashes 220
Breaststroke Mark

JOHNNY WOODD made a brilliant comeback last night in the second Pre-Olympic swimming meet in the Elizabeth Waterhouse tank at Punahou when he defeated the up and coming Budd Crabbe of the University of Hawaii in the 100 yards freestyle open to break the Hawaiian championship record established in 1931 by the latter, his time being 54 seconds flat.

In all, four records were shattered during the course of the evening. The meet produced some thrilling and close races.

The 100-yard open Hawaiian championship event was closely clashed by Woodd and Crabbe. Both boys got off to a good start and swam on even terms for the greater part of the race, employing powerful strokes that sent them gliding through the water at a rapid pace.

GETS ADVANTAGE

Woodd got the advantage and forged into the van when he beat Crabbe at the turn on the final lap. Crabbe made a desperate effort to overtake Woodd, but the latter took
