utes, 5 seconds.

The only other contestant was William Kahele, also of Hui Makani, whose time was 28 minutes, 26 seconds.

May's time at the 1,500 meter mark was 21 minutes, 46 4-5 sec-

onds.

Both the senior and junior one mile events were run off simul-taneously, the three senior swimmers on the makai side and seven juniors along the mauka side of

the pool.
