

CRABBE VICTOR IN 1500 METERS

14-Year-Old Boy Right Behind Buster in Long Grind

CINCINNATI, July 14.—Hawaii will not be represented in the sprint events of the Olympic Games swimming contests it was determined today when Johnny Woodd, of Honolulu, failed to qualify in the 100 meters finals.

Al Schwartz, of Chicago, won the finals in the 100 meters with Ray Thompson, of the United States Naval Academy second and Manuella Kalili, Honolulu swimmer representing the Hollywood Athletic Club, third. These three qualified.

WILL TRY 400

Malola Kalili failed to qualify in the 100 meters, but is also entered in the 400 meters event. Woodd will also attempt to make a place on the team by qualifying in the 400 meters race.

In the first heat of the semi-finals qualifying for the finals of the 100 meter event Thompson finished in 59 4/5 with George Fissler, New York Athletic Club, second and Malola Kalili, third.

All three swimmers were even at the first 50 meter mark but Thompson finished in front following a brilliant sprint. In the second heat of the same event Manuella Kalili won by a nose in 60 flat with Schwartz finishing second and Highland third. In this heat Wood, whose muscles were tied up, swam fifth.

BUSTER WINS EASILY

Buster Crabbe, Los Angeles Athletic Club, finished first among the qualifiers in the finals of the 1500 meter event. His time was 20:19 1/5. Ralph Flanagan, 14-year-old swimmer of Miami Beach, was second and James Cristy, University of Michigan, was third.

Crabbe led after the first 100 mark and finished about 20 meters ahead of Flanagan.
