Miss Madison Favored

JONES BEACH, N. Y., July 15.—Dominated as usual by Helene Madison of Seattle, trials for the United States Women's Olympic swimming and diving team moved through trial stages to the finals today with Miss Madison the overwhelming favorite to win the 400 meters free-style and qualify for the team:

Yards ahead of her competitors, Miss Madison won both her heat and the semifinal trial in 5 min. 49 4-5 sec., excellent time in the rough water of Tidewater bay in a smart breeze.

Eleanor Holm, backstroke champion, found a worthy rival in the 100 meter backstroke in Louisa Roberts of Atlanta, national junior champion. Both won their heats, qualifying for the finals later today, but Miss Roberts' time of 1 min. 25 2-5 sec., was three fifths second faster than Miss Holm.

Miss Holm had little opposition, however. Miss Roberts was pushed by Joan McSheehy of New York, who was second by one fifth second.

Trials in the high platform dive were cancelled owing to the hazards of wind and choppy water.
