

# Buster Crabbe In Fine Shape; Breaststroke Is Scheduled For Tuesday

LOS ANGELES, Aug. 8.—Forty thousand persons witnessed the Olympic games Saturday.

Ned Crabbe, father of Buster, said, "Buster is in the best shape of his career with Chilton rubbing him now."

Manuella Kalili won the first heat of the 100 meter swim in 59.6 seconds and was third in the semi finals with a time of 59.3 seconds. Miyazaki and Kawaishi won the semi final heats in 58.7 seconds.

Japan is the favorite to win the swimming meet.

Duke Kahanamoku has been chosen an alternate on the American water polo team, according to Les Henry. Dudley Pratt has been elected to become an official turning judge.

Lt. Richard Mayo of the United States army was third in the pentathlon competition, finishing 17th in the 4,000 meter cross country run, last event in the five day competition.

Count Johan Gabriel Oxenstierna of Sweden won the gruelling athletic test. There was great interest in this gentleman's competition.

The 3,000 meter steeplechase went an extra lap by mistake. It was hard luck for Volmari Isohella of Finland, who won the race. His time for the 3,000 meters was announced as 9 min. 18 4-10 seconds.

Sunday the same ideal weather

prevailed and eighty thousand persons stormed the stadium.

## Japan Wins Swim

Japan won first two places in the 100 meter swim. Thompson of the United States turned first at the 50 meter mark, with Kalili second. The Americans led the field up to 70 meters, when they were overtaken by Miyazaki, who won. Manuella was nosed out at the finish by another Japanese flash, Kawaishi, and by Schwartz of the United States. Kalili was fourth. His time was 59.2 seconds, one second slower than the winner's time.

## Tough Schedule

Buster Crabbe has a tough schedule in the 1,500 meter swim heat Thursday. Taris of France and Kitamura of Japan are in the same heat. Kitamura is the boy who beat Makino, who in turn beat Buster Crabbe in Japan.

Boy Charleton and Alberto Zorrilla are in the second heat.

Maiola Kalili is only on the relay team. He can't get into the 400 meter competition.
