

CRABBE PLACES FOR THE FINAL 1,500 METERS

Shozo Makino Leads Honolulu By Speedy Spurt; Makes New Record

Koike Sets New Mark In 200 Meter Breaststroke; Dorothy Poynton Wins

LOS ANGELES, Aug. 12.—Unofficial leaders in Olympic standings before today's events were: United States 603, Italy 228½, France 174, Finland 139, Sweden 132½, Germany 114½, Great Britain 105, Japan 82, Hungary 81.

LOS ANGELES, Aug. 12.—Shozo Makino of Japan won the second heat of the 1,500 meter freestyle semifinals in the Olympic games today, with Clarence Crabbe of the United States placing second. Both qualified for the final tomorrow.

After swimming neck and neck with Crabbe, United States, Noel Ryan and Andrew Charlton of Australia for half the distance, Makino started pulling away.

Makino apparently ignored the Olympic record of his teammate, Kasuo Kitamura, a few minutes before and paddled the distance in 19 minutes 38.7 seconds, which was 12.8 seconds faster than the first heat. It was the third time the Olympic record has been shattered during the afternoon.

Like Kitamura, who set the record in the preceding heat, he finished with a burst of speed, winning by a third of the length of the tank ahead of Crabbe.

After leading for 24 laps in the first semifinal heat, Jean Taris, French veteran, was forced to yield the lead today to the phenomenal 14 year old Japanese schoolboy, Kitamura, who with a terrific sprint finished 20 meters ahead of Taris.
