

# Name Searle Chairman of A.A.U. Swim Committee

Theodore (Pump) Searle, former football star and now swimming coach at the University of Hawaii, has been appointed chairman of the swimming committee of the Hawaiian Association of the A. A. U.

The appointment was announced by President J. R. Farrington at the meeting of the board of managers of the A. A. U. held last evening at the Central Y. M. C. A. Searle will name the other members of his committee within the next several days and the committee will start functioning at once.

Recommendations of the swim survey committee, headed by F. S. Field, were submitted to the board of managers at last night's meeting and have been turned over to Searle's swimming committee. The recommendations are for a four

year swimming program for Hawaii.

The local A. A. U. also named Bob Kiphuth, Yale swimming coach, delegate to the national A. A. U. convention to open at New York Sunday and a wire was sent to Kiphuth asking him to represent Hawaii and authorizing him to cast Hawaii's votes.

Local delegates were named to the convention, but as none could make the trip it was decided to ask Kiphuth to represent the Hawaiian association.

The registration committee announced that sanction has been granted the Outrigger Canoe club to stage its annual open water swim program along Waikiki beach on Thursday, November 24.

Only athletes registered with the A. A. U. are eligible to compete.
