There will be a memorial gathering of family and friends of Thomas Wells at 7 a.m. Jan. 3 at the Outrigger Canoe Club.

Wells, 58, formerly of Honolulu, died Nov. 21 in Aspen, Colo. He was the founder of the prominent Honolulu architectural firm of Thomas Wells & Associates of Honolulu.

Wells' firm was responsible for such Hawaii projects as the Waikiki Yacht Club, the Tennis Garden at Kapalua, Maui, and the Waimea Village Inn.

He also had a part in the design of such varied projects as the Pacific Club, the Aspen Institute/Hawaii and the Mauna Kea Resort.

He was a former chairman of the beautification committee of the Honolulu Chamber of Commerce and worked as a consultant for the state Department of Land and Natural Resources.

He was also a board member of Hawaii Nani Loa, a group dedicated to the preservation of Hawaii's natural beauty. Wells was a frequent critic of local planners and builders for their failure to consider aesthetics and open space in building Honolulu.

He was born in San Francisco. He is survived by a daughter, Sharon, and a brother, Jack.

OCC and the Rainbows were tied, 8-3, before the older, more experienced club team capitalized on the collegians' errors to gain the victory. UH Coach Alan Rosehill felt his team played well considering the youth of the squad (only one senior, two freshman starters) and that OCC was made up almost totally of past All-Americans who beat a number of Top 10 college teams.

The 'Bows were led by freshman Brian Poppinga's 21 kills and seven blocks while sophomore Allen Allen added 17 kills. UH, ranked ninth in the Tachikara preseason poll, opens its Western Intercollegiate Volleyball Association season at Stanford Monday.
