Area paddlers to race in Commonwealth Games

WINDWARD — Paddlers from Windward Oahu will take part in the World Sprint Canoe Championship Tuesday through Jan. 20 in Auckland, New Zealand. The championship will serve as the opening event of the Commonwealth Games.
Stan Dickson of Kahaluu will lead a group of junior paddlers from the Healani Canoe Club in both boys and girls competition. The girls, ranging from ages 17-18, are Stacey Dickson, Chantelle Jenkins and Terisa Garrett, Malia Ford, Elizabeth Chun and Lesley Iaukea.
Dickson and Jenkins, both students at Castle High, and Garrett, a student at Kamehameha, are from the Windward side.

The boys, whose ages range from 16-19, are Puni Haskell, Travis Ukauka, Adrian Pang Kee, Shane Lopes, Kaleo Pilonca and Kai Parker.
All but Parker are from the Windward side. Lopes attends Castle, while Haskell, Ukauka and Pang Kee are Castle graduates. Pilonca and Parker, who is from Hawaii Kai, attend Kamehameha.
There also will be junior paddlers from Team Surf, Outrigger and Hui Nalu canoe clubs, Dickson said. There also will be adult and masters' division paddlers from other clubs, including the Kailua Canoe Club. (Kailua participants' names weren't available at press time.)
The Commonwealth Games are the closest canoe paddlers have to the Olympics, Dickson said.

his title in the initial event of the 1990 Hawaii Kayak Racing season. It was Graf's first victory in a major race.
Lorey Bode took first in the women's division (four-mile course), ahead of defending champion Denise Darval. Bode's time was 38:55 and Darval finished in 39:39.
Sixty paddlers competed in the race, which was run in almost no wind or surf. Race officials attributed the smaller number (last year 97 participated) to the International Canoe Federation World Championships in New Zealand and the Ala Wai Challenge, which both took place the same weekend.
The series continues Jan. 27 with an eight-mile race from Hawaii Kai to Outrigger. The Outrigger Canoe Club is spon-

soring. The 10-date schedule concludes May 20 with the 13th annual Molokai-to-Oahu race, now called the Bankoh Kayak Challenge.
Bode set the women's record for the 32-mile race last year, finishing in 4:44:14. Oscar Chalupsky holds the men's mark of 3:35:59 set two years ago.
